## The Isle of Anglesey

Spend the day exploring Anglesey, accompanied by a local guide. As well as learning more about the island, visit Plas Newydd, an enchanting National Trust property overlooking the Menai Straits. The historic mansion contains the largest exhibition of Rex Whistler's works, and unique artefacts from the Battle of Waterloo can be found in the military museum.

## Ffestiniog Steam Railway

Ffestiniog Railway, in the heart of Snowdonia, is a 13.5-mile journey with dramatic views of mountains, lakes and waterfalls. Recognized as the world's oldest independent railway company, it is a major component of the UNESCO "Slate Landscape of Northwest Wales" World Heritage Site.

## Portmeirion

The iconic Italianate architecture, designed by Welsh architect Sir Clough Williams-Ellis in the early 20th century, makes this an intriguing place to visit. The colourful collection of buildings is fringed with wondrous ornamental gardens, giving this village a subtropical feel that seems far flung from Wales.

## Snowdon Mountain Railway

Take a return trip to the summit of majestic Mount Snowdon on the Snowdon Mountain Railway. Visitors from all over the world have been enjoying the experience of travelling on this unique mountain railway since 1896. From the peak of the highest mountain in Wales, you can view the breathtaking vistas of Snowdonia stretching out for miles.

## Beaumaris & Beaumaris Castle

The Isle of Anglesey's captivating seaside town is a mix of medieval, Victorian and Edwardian architecture. Stroll along the seafront with views over the Menai Strait and Snowdonia before discovering the charming streets with picturesque pastel-painted cottages, lively cafes and independent shops, perfect for souvenir buying. A UNESCO World Heritage site and one of the finest castles in Wales, Beaumaris Castle sits in a scenic setting overlooking the mountains and sea.

## Llandudno

Llandudno offers seaside charm with Victorian flair, inviting visitors to stroll the promenade, ride the historic tram or cable car up the Great Orme for panoramic views, explore Wales' longest pier, discover local history at the Llandudno Museum or Home Front Museum and enjoy the beach all while surrounded by stunning North Wales scenery.

## National Memorial Arboretum

The UK's year-round centre of Remembrance and home to iconic Armed Forces Memorial, this expansive site features almost 400 thought-provoking memorials, nestled amongst lush maturing woodland. The memorials are rich in design and symbolism and sympathetic to the surrounding landscape.

## Jodrell Bank

See the iconic, world-renowned Lovell Telescope and explore the UNESCO World Heritage site's engaging science exhibits. Jodrell Bank offers a unique opportunity to learn more about the history of space exploration and ongoing scientific discoveries at a working research facility.

## Celtic Royal Hotel Caernarfon

The traditional 3\* Celtic Royal Hotel dates back to the 18th century and is located just a 10 minute walk away from Caernarfon Harbour. The hotel features its own restaurant, a wood-panelled bar and bistro, as well as leisure facilities including an indoor heated swimming pool. The en-suite bedrooms come equipped with a TV, a hairdryer and tea/coffee making facilities.
